Application Fee

A non-refundable application processing fee of £35 must accompany the application for admission.

Academic Quarter System

Any three quarters are considered an academic year. The standard academic year is comprised of Fall (October), Winter (January) and Spring (March) quarters. There is a Summer Intercession in June and additional Summer quarter commencing in July. See Academic Calendar for details.

Online Course Fee

Students enrolling in a Virtual Campus online course will be charged an online course fee in addition to the tuition charge for the course. The online course fee includes

Virtual Campus access, online library, 24/7 technical support, and all course materials, which may include e-books, textbooks, and/or software. The online course fee is as follows:

Graduation Fee

A non-refundable graduation fee (currently £80, subject to change) will be billed to students earning a degree, during the last quarter of their program.

Part-time

Students taking less than 15 credit hours per quarter will be charged the Part-time tuition rate, subject to student visa regulations.

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Academic Overload

Students taking more than 15 credit hours per quarter will be charged the Academic overload tuition rate. Academic overloads are subject to prior approval by the Program Dean.

Supplies

Students are responsible for providing materials and supplies required for classes. Although costs of supplies vary according to the program of study, students should plan on an average of £150 per quarter for basic art, design and/or drafting supplies. Advanced classes require additional supplies, and the costs are determined by the student's choice of projects.

Studio/Lab Fees

Some courses require a studio/lab fee. History of Theatre Class carries an additional fee of £175.

Student Housing (optional)

Accommodation is provided on a term-by-term basis for students who request housing. The non-refundable housing fee is £2,350 per term. A £50 Dorm key deposit will be charged in the first term. Once the key is returned to the Student Housing Office, the deposit will be refunded. If the key is not returned, deposit is non-refundable. Single, Ensuite (private bathroom/ shower) rooms make up the majority of our room types. Double and triple share accommodation may also be available once the single rooms are filled. For details please speak to your Admissions Advisor or refer to the online housing brochure. Housing charges are subject to change. Availability and choice of rooms are subject to demand.

London South Bank University Validated Programs

Students enrolled in London South Bank University validated programs will be required to pay an enrollment fee upon signing an agreement in their senior year with AIU London. The enrolment fee is £363. This enrolment fee is subject to change.

Study Trips (optional)

Study trips to various parts of the world are scheduled annually. The fee covers round-trip transportation, hotel accommodation and tuition. Students are responsible for their meals and incidentals. Students may earn 5 hours of academic credit upon satisfactory completion of requirements set by the instructor.

Registration for Classes

AIU London is committed to ensuring that students are able to register for classes in a timely manner. To this end the following regulations governing registration and the payment of the late registration fee have been put in place:

Stage 1 - Registration

Students with no outstanding balance can register for classes as soon as registration opens. The tuition fee payment deadline is 5 pm on the last working day before classes begin.

Registration deadline for Stage 1 is 5 pm on the last working day of the active term.

Students, who register for classes in stage 1 but fail to pay by the above deadline, will be charged a non-refundable Late Payment fee of £500 on the first day of term.

Failure to make final payment or payment arrangements with Finance by 5 pm of the last working day before drop/add ends will result in students being dropped from all classes, and not allowed to resume their studies that term.

Stage 2 - Registration

Students who register after Registration deadline will be required to pay tuition at the time of registration.

Stage 3 - Late Registration

Students who failed to register in stages 1 and 2, can still pay tuition and register during the drop/add period, during the first week of term.

All students registering in stage 3 will incur a non-refundable £250 Late Registration fee. Students will not

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be allowed to register or make any changes to their schedule after 5 pm five working days after the start of the term (i.e. second Monday of term).

Notes:

1. Students taking less than 15 credit hours during the June five week Summer intercession will not incur the part-time tuition premium and will be charged on a full-time per credit hour basis.
2. The application fee is a one time fee that may only be waived in certain circumstances. The application fee may only be waived for students who are: re-entering; re-enrolling; enrolling with established articulation or Education Partner agreements; AIU Alumni; transferring from a CEC school; or for attendance at university-sponsored career events.
3. The University Catalogue policies and procedures, and terms and conditions in this Tuition and Fee rates, are correct at the time of going to press, and may be subject to change. Students should consult their Academic Advisors and the latest University Catalogue for specific information on any policy.
4. Custom suite of course materials for the Virtual Campus online courses are provided to the student by Words of Wisdom, LLC. At the University's discretion, books may be delivered in an electronic (e-Book) or standard textbook format. Students not wishing to use e-Books are responsible for any additional charges associated with purchasing standard textbooks.
5. The University does not charge for transfer credits.

Fee Status

American InterContinental University London (AIU London) follows the guidance of the United Kingdom government under the (Fees and Awards) Regulations of 1997. Under these regulations, students who are classified as being non-home students may be charged at higher rates than those who are 'home' students.

What is a 'home' student?

To be classified as a 'home' student, an applicant must have both of the following.

- The applicant must have settled status in the UK within the meaning of the immigration act (1971) on his/her 'Relevant date';
– AND –
- The applicant must have been 'ordinarily resident' in the UK (or the Channel Islands or Isle of Man) for at least three years immediately preceding their 'Relevant date'. (Note that under the regulations, the qualifying period of ordinary residence must not have been wholly or mainly for the purpose of full-time education.)

Further information as to the nature of 'settled status' and 'ordinarily resident' is available on request. Students who are UK nationals and have lived in the UK for their entire life would normally be expected to be classified as a 'home' student.
